



Kingston Park Primary Academy Child-Friendly Anti-Bullying Policy

At Kingston Park, we ensure all children are safe, happy and proud of being a part of the Kingston Park family.

If children ever feel unsafe or unhappy, we offer them support from our caring staff to help make them feel better.

What is bullying?

Bullying is when a pupil or group of pupils are unkind to another repeatedly which results in hurting them physically or emotionally.

What does bullying look like?

- Physical assault
- Verbal - Name calling
- Taking or damaging belongings.
- Cyber bullying - being unkind on the internet or on a mobile device



What do our staff do to ensure bullying doesn't happen in our school?

- All our staff ensure our school is a happy and safe place to be.
- We have regular discussions to ensure everyone gets on with each other.
- We have anti-bullying week every year
- We hold regular assemblies focussed around anti-bullying
- We have regular pupil voices about anti-bullying

What if bullying does happen?

Members of staff will talk to all pupils involved and help them to solve the problem.

Staff will monitor the pupils after to ensure it doesn't happen again. They will also speak to parents / carers to make them aware of what has happened.

What should I do if I see someone being bullied?

- Never be a bystander - Tell an adult straight away
- Make the victim feel better
- Don't try and solve it yourself because you may then get hurt
