All staff are aware that, pupils in receipt of pupil premium funding, boys and SEND are groups we focus on during monitoring. During RAG challenge meetings, these pupils are a focus. Updates are provided to AAB so challenge can be provided by AAB The Pupil Premium Strategy is written by staff and focuses on each child's individual needs. Regularly reviewing progress has led to more targeted interventions. SEND progress where below Key Stage is monitored with B squared. This has enabled staff to better target next small steps leading to more consistent progression. Overall, boys outperformed girls in the combined measure at the end of KS2 (only for those achieving the expected standard). |

Implement Talk 4 Writing Strategy | All staff | September 2022-July 2023 | Increase in pupils' participation, confidence and achievement levels. | T4W project has engaged all pupils in writing across the curriculum. Authors and poets lead assemblies and workshops to engage boys in writing. ADPs for English were written to include specific targets for engagement in writing. Invested in engaging hooks and spent dedicated time during CPD looking at good practice. During the KS2 writing moderation, the moderator commented that children at KPA clearly enjoy writing. Girls outperformed boys in the end of KS2 assessments. |
